

Kenworth History

The Kenworth story began in 1912, in Seattle, Washington. Brothers George T and Louis Gerlinger Jr operated a car and truck dealership known as Gerlinger Motors. In 1914 they built their own-design truck with a more powerful six-cylinder engine than the typical fours that were available.

It also had a cab with steel, not wood framing. This proved ideal for logging in the rugged Northwest.



They filed for bankruptcy in 1917 and Edgar Worthington and Harry Kent purchased and reincorporated as the Kenworth Motor Truck Company in 1923.
